



Meter of the Month

My Meter of the month is supplied by Peter Mantell and shows a strange printing hiccup on the upper print head of a Francotyp-Postalia Ultimail 90 machine, serial FU9001111. The frank was applied on a label and shows an attempt to print a 'ghost' fifth digit in the upper half of the value die. The full image is shown below:



For what it is worth, if the image of the upper half of the value die is artificially re-positioned so that the digits '223' are aligned with the lower half, the result obtained is shown here. All this does is to suggest that the 'ghost' digit is actually the second zero, and it doesn't provide any real clue as to what could have caused the glitch in the first place.



Editorial

There have been reports in the press recently that sales of franking machines have seen a marked rise in sales since the postal rate increases in April. Undoubtedly, small businesses are taking advantage of the significant discounts currently being offered by Royal Mail for meter franked mail. For example, the rate for second class stamped mail has risen to 50p, compared to just 31p for meter franked mail.


Advanced Mail


Peter Mantell reports this 2009 frank from Pitney Bowes Ltd. offices in Harlow. It includes the text 'AIRMAIL' in large text.



Peter also has found this frank where a spurious full stop has appeared after 'LONDON' in the town die.




Your editor has found this frank where the senders return address details are all in lower case letters.

Further to page 133-4, your editor reports that machine N1358336 appears to be permanently printing a blank date as the date is still being entered manually nearly 9 months on.




Printed Postage Impressions


Last of Breed

Peter Mantell reports two series that haven't been seen for a very long time, namely the PBG and ASA series.




PB Connect+ Slogans



David Jones sends this attractive swan design from the <a>Canal & River Trust based in Leeds.






Further to pages 62-7 and 114-8, Peter Mantell reports our third 'Air Ambulance' frank – this time it is from the Cornwall Air Ambulance.
