A new Head Office for Pitney Bowes

On page 120-3 we illustrated three images from PB555206 with a town die of 'Harlow'. Your editor has recently noticed, after some absence, the re-appearance of this machine with a town die of 'Hertford'. The Pitney Bowes web site reveals they have moved their Head Office to Hatfield – a distance of about 6 miles from Hertford. Their new Head Office address is:

Why the town should read 'Hertford' rather than 'Hatfield' is not clear at this stage. Hertford is actually a smaller town with a population 24,750 compared with Hatfield's 30,000.



Below are images of the latest numbers reported this month – with contributor's initials shown in the bottom left of the image.



The highest number, PB098876 illustrated above, is also interesting for other reasons and the complete image is shown below. Not only does it bear the first (and only one so far) reported Christmas slogan for 2012, but the frank has been applied blue ink which is unusual for an entry-level machine.



Is it possible that 'blue' has now become the default standard colour for all new machines produced by Pitney Bowes? That is probably not the case as your editor reports PB098155 in red ink dated the previous week on 21.11.12. Also, as this series gets ever closer to PB099999, we are eagerly waiting to learn what will happen after the series reaches that point.



Recent Interesting Items




Examples of the PB16 series are still fairly elusive but Peter Mantell reports this one to add to the collection so far.

Instructional Markings

Your editor reports this date correction handstamp from the South Midlands Mail Centre based at Northampton. It reads simply 'SMMC / 07 SEP 2012' and has been applied to correct the date of '6.9.12' on the frank.



Printed Postage Impression (PPI) News

Your editor has come across this unusual 'double' PPI that has been printed on a label. The right-hand half has been printed in the normal 'Smart Stamp' style but there is an additional 'Postage Paid' indicia on the left-hand side, together with the Royal Mail cruciform logo.



The serial number of the PPI is '11369651' which is a very large number – much bigger than the highest number reached with the normal number allocation for these (i.e. somewhere around 55000). Your editor would be pleased to receive any explanations for this, together with any further reports of PPIs of this kind.
